THE SURFACES OF TOY SHIELDS MADE FOR CHILDREN WERE LEFT PLAIN AND UNDECORATED. YOUNG BOYS WOULD NOT YET BE FAMILIAR OR CONSCIOUS OF THE VISUAL GRAMMAR ASSOCIATED WITH THE SIMPLE GRAPHIC DESIGNS AND HAD NO NEED TO STRESS OR STATE THEIR IDENTITY. ONLY AT THE COMPLETION OF A CERTAIN STAGE IN A BOYS INITIATION WAS HE GIVEN HIS 'PROPER' SHIELD.
