IT IS NOW THOUGHT THAT THE TSONGA MIGRATED TO NATAL FROM SOUTHERN MOZAMBIQUE AS EARLY AS THE 1850'S.

THEY WERE RENOWNED FOR THEIR WOOD CARVING AND WERE SOON PRODUCING ARTEFACTS OFTEN FOR SALE TO EUROPEAN SETTLERS.

THE CONICAL HEADDRESS SEEN ON THIS FIGURE IS OCCASIONALLY CARVED ON TSONGA STAFFS WITH MALE FIGURES, BUT IT IS NOT KNOWN WHETHER THEY ARE INTENDED TO DEPICT UNUSUAL HAIRSTYLES OR COLONIAL HATS, AS IT IS ONLY USUAL FOR TSONGA MARRIED WOMEN TO HAVE A PEAKED COIFFURE DENOTING THEIR MATRIMONIAL STATUS. THIS FIGURE IS SEATED ON A EUROPEAN STYLE CHAIR, AND OUTLINED IN POKER WORK, HE IS WEARING A CHIEF'S NECKLACE.
