THE 'SCEPTER' OR 'SCEPTRE' WAS AN EMBLEMOF RANK WITHIN THE CHOKWE'S HIERARCHY. CLUB-LIKE SCEPTRES TOOK THE GENERAL FORM OF WEAPONS ONCE USED IN WAR OR 'FOR PROTECTION AGAINST SLAVE RAIDERS'. IN CEREMONIAL CONTEXTS THE SCEPTRES BECAME SYMBOLS OF POWER AND STATUS.
